CISRS SKILLS ASSESSMENT (ADVANCED SCAFFOLDER CARD)

COURSE CONTENT

The law requires that any individual wishing to erect, alter or dismantle scaffolding must be able to prove their competency. The industrywide accepted proof of competency for operatives is to hold a CISRS Advanced Scaffolder card. To be eligible to apply for this card, candidates must successfully complete the following 3 elements of training, all of which are available at NETA:

- CISRS Advanced
- Level 3 QCF National Diploma in Accessing Operations and Rigging (Construction) Scaffolding
- CISRS Advanced Skills Test

The 2 day CISRS Skills Assessment (Advanced Scaffolder Card) is for delegates who are already Scaffolder card holders who have already successfully completed their Advanced course, their Level 3 QCF National Diploma in Accessing Operations & Rigging (Construction) qualification and gained the minimum 6 months scaffold experience since completion of their Advanced.

AIM

The 2 day CISRS Skills Assessment is a practical assessment in which delegates will be required to erect 2 scaffolding structures in accordance with current regulations. It is designed to assess that the delegate can demonstrate the skills learnt during the CISRS Advanced course.

Pre-Requisite

Delegates must have successfully completed a tube and fitting Advanced CISRS scaffolding course and be able to be able to provide evidence of this training in the form of certificates. Delegates must also have the minimum six months further scaffold experience.

Any physical impairment or literacy issues should be discussed during the booking stage to ensure we can best accommodate your needs.

Course Duration 2 days.

Maximum Number 3 persons.

Assessment

Safe erection and dismantling of 2 of the 3 scaffold types listed in objectives.

Certification

Certificates will be included in the cost of this course and CISRS certificates will be produced by NETA. They will be forwarded to the delegate directly or to their sponsor as soon as possible.

Please Note: NETA will apply for the relevant card on successful completion of the CISRS Skills Assessment using the delegates Heath, Safety and Environment Test or recognised exemption through the CWA system.

Equipment

Delegates must wear PPE (Personal Protective Equipment) during the practical aspects of the course. Delegates will be required to provide:

- Hard Hat
- Safety Boots
- Gloves
- High visibility vest or overalls (optional)
- Safety Harness with 1.7m lanyard and rear anchor point
- Tools
 - Ix 7/16 swingover spanner
 - 1x Belt and frogs
 - 1x 6" spirit level
 - 1x 5m Tape measure

Refresher

CISRS Advanced Scaffolder cards are valid for 5 years and card holders will be required to complete the Health & Safety test or equivalent in order to renew their card.

Please Note: Health, Safety & Environment tests are valid for 2 years from the pass date and therefore holding a valid CISRS card does not necessarily mean that your Health and Safety is still valid.
