

NEBOSH NATIONAL GENERAL CERTIFICATE IN OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH & SAFETY

Aim

The NEBOSH General Certificate in Occupational Health and Safety training course is a widely recognised qualification for general health and safety responsibilities.

The NEBOSH National General Certificate is broken down in to the following units:

- Unit NG1 Management of Health and Safety
- Unit NG2 Controlling Workplace Hazards

Pre-Requisite

There are no entry requirements for this qualification, however it is important that learners have a suitable standard of English language in order to understand and articulate the concepts contained in the syllabus.

This qualification is ideal for anyone who needs a broad understanding of health and safety issues to be able to manage day-to-day risks effectively. Many people take the National General Certificate in Occupational Health and Safety (NGC) as a first step in a career in health and safety. It gives a valuable overview, and is a sound basis for further professional study.

A PC / laptop is required and knowledge of Microsoft Word / computer systems would be advantageous.

Course Duration

Full Time:

10 Days + 1 Exam Day + Interview + Home Study

Part Time:

15 Days + 1 Exam Day + Interview + Home Study

Maximum Number

10 delegates

Assessment

Each delegate is required to sit an open book exam (NG1), attend an interview (NG1) and submit a written practical risk assessment (NG2).

What is an Open Book Exam?

An open book examination (OBE) enables you to sit your NEBOSH assessment on your own, usually in your own home or another safe and suitable location where you can concentrate.

To help you during the open book examination you can use resources such as notes, textbooks, learning materials and online resources.
