- Know how to provide first aid to a casualty with suspected major illness

- Identify how to administer first aid for suspected:
 - Fractured ribs
 - Penetrating chest injury
- Recognise and Identify how administer first aid for burns
- Identify how poisonous substances can enter the body and how to administer first aid
- Recognise and identify how to administer first aid for a casualty with suspected anaphylaxis
- Demonstrate the use of a 'training device' adrenaline auto-injector
- Recognise and identify how to administer first aid to a casualty suffering from suspected:
 - Heart Attack
 - o Stroke
 - o Epileptic seizure
 - Asthma attack
 - o Diabetic hypoglycaemic emergency
